GRAND RAPIDS PUBLIC MUSEUM



The Public Museum has been collecting things since 1854, and now has more than a million objects in the collection. You name it, we've probably got it. These artifacts, some exquisitely beautiful, some quite rare, some precious, historical or bizarre, are on display in small, permanent exhibits throughout the three floors of the Van Andel Museum Center. The museum has many special exhibits and hand-on attractions to enjoy such as:

The Habitats is a large, meandering exhibit that transports young and old alike through the natural environments of Michigan. The life-like exhibits of mounted animals and plants in their natural settings must be seen to be believed. Dioramas with light, sound, images and hands-on activities that kids can use to learn about fish in Lake Michigan, microscopic life in a drop of marsh water, fragile sand dune, wetland, and woods ecosystems and the impact of the lifestyle choices humans make that affect the natural environment.

Leonardo da Vinci: Machines in Motion: reveals one aspect of the multi-faceted ingenuity of Leonardo da Vinci (1452-1519), who was a painter, sculptor, musician, architect, engineer and anatomist. His thousands of manuscripts, collectively named the "Codicices," contain designs that are the precursors of many modern machines and devices, including the car jack, glider, parachute and armored vehicle. The exhibit contains 40 machines that were built after in-depth study of Leonardo da Vinci's designs by a group of scientists and skilled craftsmen. Visitors may touch and set them in motion, combining fun with instruction. The exhibits take the spectator into the magical world of machines devised by Leonardo da Vinci.

The Roger B. Chaffee Planetarium is named after the Grand Rapids-born astronaut who lost his life in the 1967 Apollo 1 spacecraft fire. The Planetarium is complete with computerized Digistar and laser projectors, producing multiple video and still images and incredible special effects, accompanied by high-powered digital sound

1928 Spillman Engineering Co. Carousel is available year-round to museum visitors for rides revolving to the music of a Wurlitzer band organ. Highlights include 44 hand-carved, elaborately jeweled wooden horses, two chariots and six menagerie animals (giraffe, lion, deer, goat, tiger and camel) and the original ticket booth. The interior and dome of the carousel are decorated in Art Nouveau painted panels, carved frieze and accented with brass poles and 1,200 lights.
